## EUTR Declaration

To comply with the EU Timber Regulations No 995/2010 (EUTR), effective 3 March 2013 EU importers must have in place a due diligence system that “should provide access to information about the sources and suppliers of the timber and timber products being placed on the internal market for the first time”. While exporters of US timber products into the EU or other feeder markets are not directly subject to any new legal requirements for additional documentation or declarations at point of entry to the market, Robinson Lumber Company (RLC) understands that its customers and its customers’ customers may require additional information or documentation to comply with the EUTR.

EUTR does not require that EU importers seek proof of legality for each individual consignment of product placed on the EU market; rather, EUTR requires EU importers to undertake and document a separate risk determination for each specific type of timber or timber product supplied by a particular supplier.

Both the FSC Risk Register (<https://us.fsc.org/en-us/certification/controlled-wood/fsc-us-controlled-wood-national-risk-assessment-us-nra>) and the Seneca Creek Study (<https://www.americanhardwood.org/en/environmental-profile/legality>) confirm that all US hardwood producing regions are of minimal risk in terms of illegal supply. RLC has been exporting US timber products for over 100 years and is committed to their sustainability and legality. Our analysis is that RLC’s American Hardwood products are fully EUTR compliant.
